### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Alamo has fallen. Approximately 187 defenders are dead and **All** the bodies with the exception of one were burned on the afternoon of March 6.

As we reflect back **187 years ago** on the struggles of our pioneer ancestors and their courage, we are also reminded of the men who were meeting at Washington-on-the Brazos. They not only declared Independence for Texas on March 2nd, but continued to meet, to form a new government for the Republic of Texas.



It has been a hectic time over the past two weeks, with **three Texas Honor Days** and other events. I am proud to say the Sidney Sherman Chapter has been well represented at all these events. I have enjoyed being with each of you as we have worked together to promote Texas History during the "High Holy Days" of the Texas Revolution.

As I stood in Alamo Plaza before dawn on this past March 6th, on the sacred ground where our Texian men fought and died **187 years ago** - I closed my eyes and tried to imagine what it must have been like. These men who had the opportunity to leave the Alamo during the siege, stayed and gave their lives in the struggle for Liberty and Independence. Their courage and sacrifice bought valuable time for Texas.

After the Alamo fell, Santa Anna began moving his troops toward Washington-on-the Brazos and Goliad. He also wanted to find General Houston and end the rebellion once and for all. The Texian Army retreated and the people began fleeing east, burning their houses and taking their few possessions with them. It is a cold, wet, spring with muddy roads and swollen rivers. Where will it all end?

While the sky was overcast on this past March 6th, it was also a misty morning. Hundreds of people had gathered in Alamo Plaza for the Dawn at Alamo ceremony. Members of the DRT and SRT were standing to the left of the chapel. The Alamo Defender descendants, Daughters of the Republic of Texas and the Sons of the Republic of Texas laid flowers in memory of those who died during the battle. It was an honor and privilege to lay the wreath along with our Chaplain, Robert Schnuriger on behalf of our chapter during the Dawn Ceremony.

After the Dawn ceremony, several of us joined the Alamo Heroes chapter and other SRT members for Breakfast at the Menger. At 10:00 a.m., the Alamo Heroes chapter hosted "After the Fall".

That evening, the Alamo Defenders ceremony was held. The names of all the defenders were read, under the flag of the state or country where they were born. As each defender's name was read, their descendants stood. In honor of these men and their sacrifice some of the children sang "Always Cross the Line" with the chorus . . .

. . . Always cross the line, We'll always cross the line. Just like our fathers long ago, We want our watching world to know, We're children of the Alamo. We'll always cross the line!


I look forward to seeing many of you as we work together to promote and observe various upcoming Texas Honor Days. Please make a special effort to join us this year, as we follow our mission to




#### Sidney Sherman Chapter Meeting March 21, 2023

#### Ed Cotham, Honorary Admiral, Texas Navy Association will speak on "Battle of the Bay" (including the Sidney Sherman connection)

Ed Cotham is the prize-winning author of many books and articles on Civil War history, emphasizing the battles and skirmishes in Texas. He is also very interested in nautical history and has served as project historian for several important Civil War shipwreck projects. A frequent lecturer on these subjects, Ed also leads occasional tours of Texas battlefields and state historic sites.

Ed's research interests also include a wide variety of historical events that took place in and around Texas. One of the most important of these events was the issuance of General Orders No. 3 (the "Juneteenth Order") in Galveston on June 19, 1865. In addition to a book on Juneteenth, Ed released a book relating to Ulysses S. Grant's visit to Texas in March 1880.

### Anson Jones Grave Marker Glenwood Cemetery



The Texas Statehood Day Ceremony was held on February 19, 2023 at the Anson Jones Grave Marker in Glenwood Cemetery. This ceremony was sponsored by the Sam Houston Chapter, SRT with Bart Dawson, Past President as Master of Ceremonies.

Kameron Searle was the Keynote Speaker who spoke on Anson Jones as the last President of the Republic of Texas who lowered the Texas Flag and stated "The Republic of Texas is no more". Anson Jones was married to Mary Smith Jones who was the first President of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas.

Beth McCarty, President, San Jacinto Chapter, spoke on Mrs. Jones. The Children of the Republic of Texas laid a wreath in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Anson Jones.

ANSON JONES (JANUARY 20, 1798 – JANUARY 9, 1858)

ANSON JONES WAS BORN IN GREAT BARRINGTON, ASSACHUSETTS, HE EARNED HIS M.D. DECRE IN PHILADELPHIA IN 827, BY OCTOBER 1833, JONES HAD MOVED TO TEXAS, STABLISHING A SUCCESSFUL MEDICAL PRACTICE IN BRAZORIA. IN 835, HE HELPED ORGANIZE MOLLAND LODGE NO. 36, THE FIRST AASONIC LODGE IN TEXAS. IN 1836, JONES JOINED IN TEXAS' WAR OR INDEPENDENCE AND SERVED AS JUDGE ADVOCATE AND URGEON OF THE SECOND REGIMENT. HE FOUGHT AS A PRIVATE IN HE BATTLE OF SAN JACINTO.

AFTER THE WAR, JONES RETURNED TO HIS MEDICAL PRACTICE AND N 1837 WAS ELECTED TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THAT YEAR, HE WAS ALSO ELECTED AS THE FIRST GRAND MASTER OF MASONS IN TEXAS AND WAS AMONG THE NOTED CHARTER MEMBERS WHO ORGANIZED THE PHILOSOPHICAL SOCIETY OF TEXAS. N 1838. SAM HOUSTON APPOINTED JONES AS MINISTER 'LENIPOTENTIARY OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS. IN THIS OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS. IN THIS OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS. IN THIS OF THE MERICAN SUPPORT FOR ANNEXATION BY STRENGTHENING TEXAS' TIES WITH GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE, 'JAYING AT U.S. INSECUTIES.

JONES MARRIED MARY SMITH McCRORY IN 1840; SHE WAS LATER ELECTED THE FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS. IN 1841, PRESIDENT HOUSTON APPOINTED JONES AS SECRETARY OF STATE, WHERE HE FURTHER ENCOURAGED ANNEXATION. IN 1844, JONES WAS ELECTED PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS; HE BECAME THE COUNTRY'S LAST PRESIDENT WHEN THE U.S. ANNEXED TEXAS ON DECEMBER 29, 1846, JONES OWERE THE LONE STAR FLAG AND DECLARED, THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS IS NO MORE." HE RETIRED TO BARRINGTON, HIS FLANTATION NEAR WHAT IS NOW WASHINGTON-ON-THE-BRAZOS, WHERE HE SPENT MUCH OF HIS TIME WRITING. TODAY, ANSON JONES IS REMEMBERED FOR HIS MULTINDE OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS, NCLUDING THOSE THAT EARNED HIM THE NICKNAME, "THE BACHTERC OF ANNEXATION."



#### Sam Houston Statute Hermann Park Drive Hermann Park, Houston







### Alamo Events March 5




