#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

After the Battle of San Jacinto, Santa Anna had sent orders to his second in command, General Vicente Filisola to retreat back across the Rio Grande. General Jose de Urrea had linked with General Filisola's forces and he wanted to continue the war against the Texans since the Mexicans still had over 2,500 troops against less than 900 of the Texian Army.

However, Filisola and Urrea had no choice but to follow Santa Anna's orders. The Mexican Army began their retreat through heavy rains and muddy roads. They also faced dwindling food and supplies.



On June 4, the Mexican Army at the Alamo fort formally surrenders to Juan Seguin who had been sent by Sam Houston. In its retreat, the Mexican Army camps at Rancho Chiltipiquin in San Patricio County, however extreme heat forced the army to move further on. On June 15, Filisola leading the defeated and demoralized Mexican Army crosses the Rio Grande.

The people of Texas returning to their homes and land that had been burned or destroyed, began to rebuild. They worked hard to prosper in this land of opportunity and build a future for themselves and their descendants.

Unfortunately this past month our chapter has been faced with two sad events. First on the day of our last meeting May 16, Clark Wright and his wife Cora's home burned to the ground after possibly being struck by lightning. The Nicholstone home was an historic home that had been built in the 1850's. Steve Manis is coordinating our Chapter's assistance for Clark and Cora. (please see page 7 for more information.) Also, Clark is our Secretary and Website Master and is now back posting on the Website.

In addition, Thomas Harold Houston, KSJ, a 51-year member of the San Jacinto Chapter, SRT passed away on May 22, 2023 and a graveside service was held on June 3, 2023 at Memorial Oaks Cemetery. (Please see page 10 for more information)


perpetuate the memory and spirit of the men and women who achieved and maintained the Independence of Texas.

The May meeting began with the swearing in of a new Texas Navy Admiral, Robert Gindratt by Admirals Beth Fisher and Ron Brown.








# Sidney Sherman Birthday Dinner

#### Live and Silent Auction





#### Historic Flags of the Texas Revolution

He has extensive experience in curation and management of collection at a variety of museums and libraries as well as hands-on field experience. Mike participates in most Texas including historical events enactments with the Texas Army.











## Historic Nicholstone Home



The historic Nicholstone Home is located off Park Avenue in Dickinson and faced Dickinson Bayou. The original home was constructed in the mid-1850's by Ebenezer B. Nichols, a very successful Galveston businessman, as a summer home. Nichols consulted with local Native Americans, at the time to determine the highest point on the Bayou. Nichols served as a Captain in the Army of the Republic of Texas and General in the Civil War. He was the first President of the G.H.&H Railroad, first President of the Bank of Galveston, and served in the Texas State Legislature. Upon his death in 1872, his estate was divided among his seven sons. One of the sons, Fred McCraven Nichols, bought the home and surrounding property from his brother in 1890. Since then, it has been remodeled and modified to include a second story. The home has remained in the Nichols family for over 150 year and is presently owned by Mrs. Cora Schelling Wright, the Great Great-Granddaughter of E.B. Nichols.



#### Sidney Sherman Chapter Signed up for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade


