PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

During July 1836, Santa Anna along with some of his officers were prisoners of Captain Patton, who owned a plantation near Columbia. They were placed in the Race House, a small board house with only two rooms. During this time period they had many visitors and played dominoes, checkers and rayuela.

Mrs. Hannah A. Munson (from Life on the Brazos) recorded one of the intriguing events which follows:

On one occasion a very beautiful Spanish lady, living near Brazoria, came to visit her distinguished countryman, bringing dainty edibles and fine wine. She and the "Napoleon of the West" held a very animated conversation, which Major Patton followed as closely as possible, although he was not a very fluent Spanish scholar. As she rose to go she let her glove fall at Santa Anna's feet. Major Patton recovered it and handed it to her.

Again the glove fell. This time Major Patton discovered a small note, written on tissue paper, in one of the fingers. The lady became indignant and demanded that the note be returned to her unread. This was not done, however, and sent for Mr. Vergil Phelps, who easily read that the wine in one bottle marked a certain way was drugged for the guards, and that horses would be kept in the woods nearby, night and day. If this plan failed, another bottle marked a certain way contained poison.

In the confusion, Santa Anna secured the poisoned wine and succeeded in drinking some of it. Major Patton at once placed him in the family carriage and drove him speedily to Dr. Phelp's plantation, Orozimbo. Dr. Phelps by the use of a stomach pump succeeded in saving the patient.

In late July, the prisoners were moved by Captain Patton to the plantation of Dr. James A. E. Phelps under a guard which varied from twenty-fifty men for the next five months.

The people of Texas, our ancestors continued to rebuild their lives despite the heat of a Texas summer and making plans to plant the fall crops. President Burnet was still Interim President, and the capital was at Columbia. There was much dissension as the treasury was empty, the threat of Indians and what to do with Santa Anna.








Live and Silent Auction

Silent & Live Auction Items





FORT VELASCO DAY JUNE 24, 2023



of The **Battle** Velasco. fought June 25-26. 1832. was the first true military conflict between Mexico and Texians in the Texas Revolution, colloquially referred to as the "Boston Harbor of Texas". It began when Texian Militia attacked Fort Velasco, located in what was then Velasco and what is now the city of Surfside Beach. The Mexican commander during the conflict, Domingo de Ugartechea, tried to stop the Texians, under John Austin, from transporting a cannon down the Brazos River to attack the city of Anahuac. The Texian Militia eventually prevailed over the Mexicans. Ugartechea surrendered after a two-day battle, once he realized he would not be receiving reinforcements, and his soldiers had almost run out of ammunition. On June 24, the Freeport Historical Museum and Visitor's Center sponsored the third annual Fort Velasco Day. The Sidney Sherman Chapter sponsored a booth with Texas artifacts and membership information.



As we celebrated the Fourth we are reminded of our patriot ancestors, thinking of them living in those difficult times, **"the times that tried men's souls".** Our Nation's Independence Day is a time to remember and a time to honor those sacrifices. Our ancestors helped secure our independence that led to the founding of a new Nation.

Honoring these signers and our patriotic ancestors each Fourth of July reminds us of the sacrifices endured by these brave and courageous men and women. The freedoms that we enjoy each day here in America would not have been possible without their belief in Liberty and Independence.


