

James Glover, Site Manager at Stephen F. Austin-Munson Historical County Park, Brazoria County Parks Department presented a lively program on Texas Frontier Trade in the early 1800's.

James provided information from a ledger dating from 1832 and the items entered were of much interest. There were canisters of gunpowder and caps, Brogan shoes and store-bought clothes, and whale oil for lamps for 34 cents. James dramatized the activities of mercantile of that time, using rivers for transport, and trafficking from Brazoria to Cozemel and Hayana.

We are honored to have Chandler Wahrmund, Lead Educator as our speaker for the Sidney Sherman Birthday Dinner. He will be portraying his 5th great-grandfather and San Jacinto Veteran, George Washington Robinson. Chandler is a seventh generation Texan and a member of the Sons of the Republic of Texas. He was also a member of the Children of the Republic of Texas serving several terms on the State Board of Management of that organization. Chandler has a BA in History from Texas A&M and a MA in History from the University of Alabama.

He has worked at the Institute of Texas Cultures and the George H.W. Bush Presidential Library. Chandler currently works as an educator for the Texas Historical Commission. As an educator for the THC, he has been responsible for implementing educational programs across the state, including the Fulton Mansion, Barrington Farms and at the Fanthorp Inn. Chandler recently participated as the Keynote Speaker in a Graveside Ceremony for Col. Kenneth Lewis Anderson, the last Vice President of the Republic of Texas. The ceremony was held at the Fanthorp Family Cemetery on July 20, 2024.






Second Annual Sidney Sherman Dinner Auction Items

IN MEMORIAM

Texas has lost one of its finest sons. A true Texas gentleman, Sir Knight Thomas (Tom) Bruce Green passed away on July 16, 2024, at the Richard A. Anderson Texas State Veterans Nursing Home. A founding President of the Prince Carl of Solms-Braunfels Society #50, SRT, he also served as the Hill Country District Representative. In addition, he served as the Texas State President of the Sons of the American Revolution. Tom became a member of the San Jacinto Chapter, SRT when he moved to Pearland in the early 2000's.

Tom was well known around the state for his many flag programs that included both Texas and American Revolutionary Flags. In 2006, he was appointed a Colonel in the Texas Army and was also appointed an Admiral in the Texas Navy. In 2022, Tom received The Sons of the Republic of Texas highest honor – The Lifetime Achievement Award.



After moving from New Braunfels to Pearland in the early 2000's, Tom began organizing annual ceremonies to commemorate various Texas Honor Days that included the former Presidents of the Republic of Texas. Lamar Day, Texas Statehood Day (Anson Jones gravemarker) and the Burnet-Sherman Marker Ceremony became annual events to recognize these past Presidents of the Republic of Texas. In addition, Tom began organizing a Texas Independence Day Celebration to be held in Houston. Various locations around the city included - Houston City Hall, Harris County Courthouse, and the Harris County Civil Courthouse before settling on the Sam Houston Statute at Hermann Park. Tom was also instrumental in organizing the Memorial Ceremony to commemorate the Battle of Medina and a symposium to learn more about this battle. This battle was the bloodiest battle fought in Texas.


Tom was an inspiration to all of us with his dedication and devotion to promoting Texas History and to ensuring the major events in Texas history were honored. He will be missed.
