PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Labor Day weekend found me at North Padre Island. As I relaxed on the beach and looked out over the sparkling blue and green Gulf of Mexico, my thoughts turned towards the time of the Texas Revolution and the Texian Navy. With 367 miles of coastline to protect it was a challenging task for the small fledging Texian Navy.

On November 24, 1835, the Texan government agreed to authorize the purchase of four schooners, for use in defending territorial waters. The first of the ships acquired was the former revenue service ship USRC *Ingham*, a small six-gun ship of 112 tons which was renamed *Independence*. The *Independence* became the flagship

of the First Texian Navy and was placed under the command of Captain Charles E. Hawkins. The second schooner was *Brutus*; she was nearly twice as large as the *Independence* and was placed under Captain William A. Hurd, the former commander of the privateer *William Robbins*, which was also acquired for duty in the regular navy. The *William Robbins* was renamed *Liberty* and was commanded by Captain William S. Brown, whose brother, Captain Jeremiah Brown, commanded the fourth schooner, named *Invincible*.

The three objectives of the Texian Navy were to defend their coastline from a naval Mexican invasion, and the second was to escort rebel ships back and forth between Texas and the United States, from where the main source of volunteer soldiers and supplies was coming. The third objective was to inflict serious casualties on the Mexico in the hopes of forcing them to recognize the Independence of Texas.

The third Saturday in September is Texian Navy Day, a Texas Honor Day. This day honors the brave men of the Texian Navy and their courage in defending the Texas Coastline and protecting the vital supply lines during the Texas Revolution. As is tradition, the SRT sponsors Texian Navy Day at the San Jacinto Battleground. Please join us for the Annual Commemorative Ceremony and lunch afterwards at the Monument Inn on September 21, 2024.





The next few weeks promises to be a busy time as there are several events. First is **Texian Navy Day** sponsored by The Sons of the Republic of Texas, Saturday, September 21st. The ceremony will be held at the Monument at 10:00 a.m. The next Texas Honor Day will be **Gonzales Day**, October 2nd. 
"BRINGING TEXAS NUMISMATIC HISTORY INTO THE MAINSTREAM"


James P. Bevill is an independent historian and awardwinning author. His previous works focused on economic, financial, political and naval history. He guest curated several educational exhibits on the Republic of Texas at major museums in his home state. His previous book is The Paper Republic, The Struggle for Money, Credit and Independence in the Republic of Texas, a non-fiction work on the social and economic history of Texas from the colonial period through the annexation by the United States in 1846.

He was elected as an honorary member of The Sons of the Republic of Texas for his preservation of the history of the money and the economy of the Republic of Texas. Bevill received four literary awards for this work on this early economic history of Texas and its ultimate role in the annexation of Texas by the U.S. in 1846. He is a prolific public speaker on historical topics.


He served as guest curator for the TNA sponsored exhibit "Broadsides in the Gulf" at the Texas Seaport Museum and "On the Run" at the Rosenberg Library in Galveston. His book was named as the 2010 winner of the Summerfield G. Roberts literary award by The Sons of the Republic of Texas, and as the Best Specialized book on U.S. Paper Money by the Numismatic Literary Guild at the ANA World's Fair on Money in Boston.



SAN JACINTO BATTLEGROUND

Come hear Sally Anne Schmidt and Eron Tynes present on the early history of the San Jacinto Battleground, the site of the most significant Battle of the Western Hemisphere. The movement to set apart San Jacinto Battleground as a patriotic shrine began in 1856 when a group of Texas veterans assembled at the Battleground and started a fund for a memorial monument. The San Jacinto Chapter, Daughters of the Republic, organized in 1891 with the immediate objective to *"acquire and mark the Battlegrounds of San Jacinto where our Republic was born"*. For years members of the San Jacinto chapter worked with the State Legislature to purchase the necessary acreage and in 1907 the first State Park in Texas was established. During this time San Jacinto Chapter members worked with the Texas Veterans to mark key historic sites of the battle with granite markers.

As the 100-year anniversary of the Battle of San Jacinto approached, plans to build a Monument to honor all Texas heroes rapidly intensified. Under the direction of Jesse Jones, other significant improvements to the Park for the Texas Centennial occurred and the Daughters of the Republic of Texas continued to assert influence at the site.

Sally Anne Schmidt is the Curator of the Nau Civil War Collection. For over fifteen years Sally Anne has been responsible for the care, organization, and exhibition of one of the largest private Civil War collections in the country. She received her bachelor's degree from the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland, and her master's degree and PhD from Rice University. While at Rice, she held the Jameson Fellowship at Bayou Bend Collection and Gardens in 2003 – 2004.

Currently for the San Jacinto Chapter she chairs the San Jacinto Battleground Committee and the Historic Sites Committee. In addition, she serves on the San Jacinto Planning Day Committee and is a member of the America250/Texas200 Focus Group.
