PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

December 1836

As December 1836 approached the New Republic of Texas was just a few months old. President Sam Houston had been installed as President on October 22, 1836. The Texas Congress began meeting at the site of the Rice Hotel, October 1836 and adjourned on December 22, 1836.

On December 19, 1836 the Texas Congress unilaterally set the boundaries of the Republic. It declared the Rio Grande to be the southern boundary, even though Mexico had refused to recognize Texas Independence. In December 1836, the Texas Congress authorized a military force of 3,587 men and a battalion of 280 mounted rifleman.



The first Christmas in Texas was celebrated on 1528 on the Texas Coast by Cabeza de Vaca. From the time of the Spanish Conquistadors to the reign of the cowboys, Texas has for most of its history been comprised of vast stretches of unincorporated wilderness. Most of the communities around the state were rural and did not have access to trade routes and or supplies.

Christmas in Texas usually meant holiday meals of venison, rabbit, squirrel, turkeys and other wild game. Cornmeal dumplings, preserved summer vegetables, wassail and eggnog spiked with whiskey were other Christmas favorites. Most gifts were homemade and practical. Christmas was not complete without music played late into the night. Traditional instruments include fiddles and mouth organs might be used to accompany carols and dances.

Decorations were usually fresh greenery and pinecones along with strung popcorn or cranberries. The Christmas Story from the Book of Luke was read in front of the fireplace with only light from candles or oil lamps. Many of you have Christmas family traditions like these that are passed on from generation to generation. We so deeply share the bonds of being descended from these pioneer men and women. It is the tie that binds us all together.

I want to thank Ron Schoolcraft for nominating me and to our Chapter for endorsing me and signing the letter of recommendation. I know several people also wrote letters on my behalf. I have been deeply touched and am grateful for all the support that I have received for this nomination. I am honored to work with such a dedicated group of men who work so diligently to


perpetuate the memory and spirit of the men and women who achieved and maintained the Independence of Texas.

Some of the character traits were Honesty, Loyalty, Diplomacy, Integrity, Courage and Family among others.

Trisha discussed the stages of his life, becoming a teacher, then wars with the Indians, along with Andrew Jackson, in which he almost lost his life. She traversed his life as a Senator, the only one to serve from 2 different States, Tennessee and Texas, in addition to being Governor of both. Unfortunately, he had a very short marriage and escaped to the Cherokee Nation, and then to Texas and the Revolution. Trisha emphasized the effect Margaret Lee had which brought Sam to sobriety for the rest of his life.


