### President's Message

March 1836

At Dawn on March 6, 1836, the Alamo fail to the Mexican forces and the Battle ended. General Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna and his army celebrate the fall of the Alamo and secure the town of San Antonio de Bejar. Santa Anna ordered that all bodies be gathered and burned. Gregorio Esparza's bodies were found by his brother. His brother asked permission to provide his brother with a Christian Burial. He was permitted to perform the burial not far from the Alamo.



General Sam Houston arrived at Gonzales in the Afternoon on March 11, 1836, to take command of the Texas Army. After learning from Mrs. Dickinson that the Alamo had fallen, the Army, and all the civilians of the area began what was dubbed "The Runaway Scrape." The citizens started their run for the Trinity River and the safety of the United States. The Army began its fall back while it attempted to obtain supplies, more volunteers and training so that it could become an effective fighting force capable of defeating General Santa anna and the Mexican Army.

Many of our ancestors were involved in the Revolution for Independence. We continue to honor them today for their service to the Republic of Texas. I want to personally thank all SRT members for your ancestor's commitment to Texas.

We have had a successful and busy month promoting the SRT while enjoying the fellowship of our compatriots. On February 28, we had a group SRT members who were dressed in period clothes make several presentations to the Fourth Grade Texas History Class at Travis Elementary in Houston. We were well received and the students gained greatly from the stories told and being able to experience some hands-on activities.







On March 2, a few of us begin the day at the Sam Houston Statue along with members from the San Jacinto SRT Chapter by honoring Texas Independence Day. Later in the day we gathered at Washington of the Brazos to continue the celebration of Our Texas Independence.

Representing Sidney Sherman Chapter at the laying of the wreath were Don Gay, Calib Gay, Eli Gay, Joah Gay, Carl Hill, Ron Schoolcraft, Robert Gindratt and Robert Schnuriger. After the laying of the wreath, Don Gay Jr. swore his sons Eli, Calib and Joah in as members of the Sidney Sherman SRT. It was a great day and seeing the young men sworn in in front of the Alamo was most rewarding. Steve manis was in attendance.






